# **6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

#### **Emergency Procedures**

#### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

# **Precautions for Safe Handling**

Avoid inhalation of dust, and skin or eye contact. Use only in a well ventilated area. Keep containers sealed when not in use. Prevent the build up of dust in the work atmosphere. Maintain high standards of personal hygiene i.e. Washing hands prior to eating, drinking, smoking or using toilet facilities. Avoid exposure.

# Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, out of direct sunlight and moisture. Store in suitable, labelled containers. Keep containers tightly closed. Store away from water and other incompatible materials. Ensure that storage conditions comply with applicable local and national regulations.
